Community Speedwatch

- The JPC studied a report by PC Ken Bratley (Road Safety Unit) the essential points of which are:
- 152.1 <u>Wasperton</u>. Wasperton is not suitable for CSW due to the nature of the roads and the 20mph speed limit which is in force.
- 152.2 <u>Sherbourne</u>. Moving on to Sherbourne; the nature of the streets does not lend itself to CSW. The junction with Stratford Rd and Vicarage Lane is, however, a possibility. This is the only site with potential but would need the distances to me measured accurately. Using a laser range finder, a total distance of 298m was measured to the change of speed limit sign at the A46 end which is below the minimum 300m required. Cllr Merrygold has asked PC Bratley to reconsider

Watery Lane in Sherbourne.



152.3 Barford.

Wellesbourne Rd has been approved at the bus stop near to Canon Price Rd (see below image). This site is approved for use in both directions. There is also scope for a further site on this road towards the Granville Arms.



Church Street. There is also an approved site at Church St just at the walkway to the village shop (see below). This site can be used in both directions.



154 The JPC took note and agreed there was a need for it to have its own Speedwatch camera and approved its purchase.

King George's Field

155 Cllr Murphy reported:

- Generally busy and well-used.
- More vandalism:
 - o Tennis net and fittings stolen.
 - o Stones were thrown through two windows.
- Fire damage mostly repaired.
- Still awaiting completion of door repairs and upgrade of locks.
- Leaf clearance tedious; more help is needed.

156 Cllr Sheard described additional measures to enhance security, including inside security grids over the windows at a cost of £3,200. The JPC approved this expenditure.

Village Green Wildflower Proposal

Cllr Sheard reported that Bar Zero was averse to accepting any responsibility for maintenance and mowing; an attitude which stalled the negotiations. The subject was put on hold until a satisfactory scheme of command and control might be agreed.

160 Cllr Matecki confirmed that Smith's Concrete planning application for sand and gravel extraction adjacent to Barford would be considered by WCC (and not the usual WDC) and that the JPC should make arrangements accordingly.
