The next time a fellow believer seems unpleasant towards you without good cause, why not seek the Lord about sending them the following Bible verses? They show the huge importance God attaches to Christians being "kind to one another, [and] tenderhearted" (Eph. 4:32a). Lack of kindness and gentleness between the brethren is a key reason why the Western Church is in the sad state it is today. As long as we challenge such behaviour in <u>love</u>, we are being scriptural (1 Thess. 5:14a; Gal. 6:1; Matt. 18:15; Luke 17:3 etc).

If you do feel led to photocopy the following and give it to the believer concerned, be sure to tell them why you are doing so. Let them know that it grieves you when fellow Christians appear unjustifiably cold or harsh and that this sort of conduct makes it harder for you to respect such folks and their views. (Please consider highlighting the most relevant words/passages below so the recipient doesn't think he is being admonished in <u>all</u> the areas listed here! Also, endeavour to think the best of the person. E.g. ask them in all sincerity to tell you what you did to provoke them. Above all, let us act in the same gracious spirit of these very verses.)
