Fundraisin

The fantastic news is that one year after the project commenced, the JPC Working Group ended 2014 with £86,000 secured towards the improvement of our playing fields.

We have received very positive support from organisations such as WDC, WCC, Barford Charity, Barford Trust and the JPC as well as local donations. The most recent financial award came from the WDC Rural and Urban Capital Improvement Scheme in December. After six months of hard work by the Working Group, the project was awarded £30,000 and we received some extremely positive feedback about our plans. Competition for such grants is very tough so the Working Group is delighted to have secured this investment.

As we enter 2015 we continue to be busy submitting further funding applications and are awaiting responses on other bids already submitted. We'll keep you informed of progress, but it is essential that villagers raise at least £12,500 by this summer to enable us to progress additional funding options. The more we raise locally the sooner the Working Group can apply for other sources of funding. Your support makes a huge difference!

What can you do to raise funds?

In addition to the events being organised by the Working Group, we need villagers to arrange their own activities to raise funds throughout the coming months. Some villagers have stepped forward at the drop-in sessions asking to help organise some events – more information to follow soon. So what can you do? It could be car washing, a bake-off, a social event or even a sports or leisure event. Or what about a walking supper? These proved really successful when raising funds for Barford Village Shop. You cook and host a dinner or BBQ at your house and those who you invite make a payment for the meal – with all proceeds going towards King



George's Playing Field. Not only is this great fun but also a wonderful way to meet new people or catch up with friends and raise money at the same time.
