St Peter's Churchyard and cemetery

The churchyard around St Peter's Church is closed for burials as it is full, although cremated remains may still be buried in the Garden of Remembrance. Those who live within the parish have a right to be buried in the cemetery or their ashes may be interred in the Garden of Remembrance. People from outside the parish can be buried in the cemetery at the discretion of the incumbent, the churchwardens and the PCC. There has to be a clear connection with the village and it must not preclude space for those living in the parish. It is possible to reserve particular spaces but a faculty has to be obtained for this and there are legal fees involved.

There are Diocesan guidelines and rules covering the type and size of monuments that may be placed on a grave or on the site of the burial of ashes. Any such monuments require written permission of the incumbent. Rules are intended to protect the character of the churchyard and cemetery and should be appropriate to a natural, rural setting and facilitate maintenance. These guidelines and regulations apply across the Diocese of Coventry.

VILLAGE AMENITIES:

Memorial Hall, Church Street

The Hall is for use by villagers and others for functions. Seating is available for about 90 people 'theatre style' or about 70 at tables. There is a

proscenium arch stage curtained off but available. Lighting (funded by the Lottery) is from fluorescent lights or from wall up-lighters that can be dimmed. There are male and female toilets and a Lottery funded disabled toilet beyond the lobby. There is a well-equipped kitchen and separate bar with crockery, cutlery and glasses.

There are two commemorative plaques on the front of the hall by the front door. One states that the village was mentioned in Domesday Book 1086. The other is from Warwick Rural District Council when the village won the Best Kept Village Competition. There is also a stone slab set into the front wall inscribed 'In memory of Charles Ivor Smith-Ryland. The entrance gates were erected in 1932 by subscribers of Barford and Sherbourne'. The garden is for use by those booking the Memorial Hall. The almanchier tree in the corner by Keytes Lane/Church Street was planted in 1990 to celebrate HM Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother's 90th birthday.

The Village Green

The village green is bounded by Church Street, the Memorial Hall and Fairfax Close. There is some sturdy play equipment for children near the Community Shop.

There are two commemorative trees – the red hawthorn which was the Edyvean Walker Tree planted when Barford won the Best Kept Village Competition in 1984 has been replaced by another hawthorn. This was planted outside the Community Shop in late 2008. There is a plaque relating to this on the wall of the Memorial Hall. The chestnut planted in memory of Stuart McOwen, who died in the late 1980s, died and has been replaced by an oak.

The seat near the Shop patio commemorates the 80th birthday of Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother on 4 August 1980 and it is so inscribed.

Notice Boards

There are four notice boards in the village which are for use free by any village organisation.

The one on the corner of Church Street and Wellesbourne Road was donated to the village by Barford WI to celebrate the Millennium.

The one in the Memorial Hall grounds on the corner of Church Street and Keytes Lane was given in memory of Olwen Hadley and Joan Inson. It was erected in 2000 and was officially opened by James Plaskitt MP.

The third board is on the corner of Wasperton Lane and Wellesbourne Road opposite The Granville @ Barford.

There is also a notice board by the Scout Hut just off Wasperton Lane.

George V Playing Field, off Church Lane

King George V died on 20 January 1936 and a National Memorial Fund Committee set about raising funds to assist in the purchase of playing fields in memory of the late King. It was on 3 November 1936 that King George's Fields Foundation was constituted by Trust Deed 'to promote and to assist in the establishment throughout the United Kingdom of playing fields for the use and enjoyment of the people, every such playing field to be styled King George's Field and to be distinguished by heraldic panels or other appropriate tablet, medallion or inscription commemorative of his late Majesty and of a design approved by the Administrative Council'. The Interim Report of the King George's Fields Foundation shows that, by 1946, 471 such fields had been created.

The playing field in Barford consists of some 20,000 square metres of grass. On the gatepost is a metal plaque inscribed with an heraldic device and *George V AD 1910–1936*. Behind 'South of St Peter's' there is a Coronation Oak planted to celebrate the coronation of Elizabeth II. There is also a magnolia tree planted in memory of Jaspal Randeva 27.7.1969-24.7.2004.

There is a fenced off play area for the younger children with a slide, four swings, some climbing frames, a wooden fort and two concrete tubes. There is also an *adidas* basketball hoop funded by the Sport England Lottery Fund with a marked out tarmac area. Next to this is a tarmac area with skateboard ramps and an open shelter with seating designed by Bill Worrall. There are two football goals as the field is used by the Norton Lindsey Football Club's youth teams on Sundays throughout the season.

In the south eastern corner of the field there is a wooden seat in memory of Ted Tolley 1925–1975, put there by his wife.

The field is managed by the Joint Parish Council which organises the mowing of the grass and the general maintenance.

The field is available as a car park for weddings and other events.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT:

There is an hourly bus service (route 18 or 18A) from Barford north to Warwick (connecting there with the X17 which goes past Warwick Hospital and Warwick station) and Royal Leamington Spa (going past Leamington station) and south to Charlecote, Wellesbourne and Stratford-upon-Avon. There are three pairs of bus stops – two in Wellesbourne Road (near The Granville and Barford House) and one in Bridge Street (near the junction with Wilkins Close).

Route 18 travels from Warwick to Leamington Spa along the Myton Road.

Route 18A (evenings, Sundays and Bank Holidays) follows the same route.

Timetables are displayed at the bus stops and on the Barford community web site. Timetable leaflets can be obtained from Warwick Library.

Free bus passes

Free bus passes are available allowing free travel on all UK buses (including London buses) if you are a permanent resident in the Warwick District Council area, are aged at least 60 or disabled.

Communitaxi scheme

The Communitaxi Scheme is a partnership between Warwick District Council and Racing Club Warwick to provide transport to eligible residents in rural areas (aged 60 and over) and those who have mobility problems. Participants are required to be members with a £5 fee payable.

Eligible residents will be entitled to 20 journeys per year at 52p per mile or part of a mile. After that journeys will be £1 per mile depending on availability. Eligible couples travelling together count only as one journey. If one of a travelling couple is not a member of the scheme they will be charged the basic fee.

Journeys may be made to anywhere in Warwickshire, including Coventry. Journeys are door to door. The service uses two 16 seat mini buses and three cars. All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.

The service operates 7 days a week and bookings may be made up to one week in advance. The service runs from 9 am to 9 pm. The booking telephone is open from 10 am to 4 pm. A minimum of 24 hours notice is required to book a journey although every effort will be made to give assistance in the case of an emergency.

The Barford Community Village Shop (01926 624075) is open from 8 am to 6 pm every day except Sunday when it is open from 9 am to 1 pm.
