BARFORD, SHERBOURNE & WASPERTON JOINT PARISH COUNCIL Minutes of the meeting of the Planning Committee held on Tuesday, 23 July 2002 at Sherbourne Village Hall at 7.30pm.

- <u>Apologies for absence</u> Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs R G Butler (WDC), M P Byerley, G P Grima, Mrs M Hayward, D H Hunt, R Tamlin (WDC), J T Wright.
- Planning Application -W1031/02CMO014 Land at Longbridge Farm, Composting of organic, horticultural and landscaping materials. The above planning application was considered. It was noted that Warwickshire County Council. was the planning authority for this application.

It was resolved that the County Council be advised that whilst the Council recognises and supports the need for recycling of green waste it has the following concerns on this application:

- a) Concern over the level and increase in traffic movements and safety at this busy location close to M40 junction 15. Traffic problems at this junction are already the subject of investigation by the DETR and will increase following the significant development proposed south west of Warwick.
- b) Concern at the potential to pollute the adjoining brook, river and soil..
- c) Concern that the application site is within a Special Landscape Area and designated an area of building constraint.
- d) Concern that the site is of archaeological value and that a survey should be undertaken if the granting of permission is to be considered.
- e) Concern that the application does not include details of the design number and location of buildings to be erected an essential requirement of any application.
- f) Concern that the site may seek to expand operations some time in the future.
- g) Concern that the proposal sets a precedent for other development in this location

The County Council be also advised that Members representing the Parish of Sherbourne on the Joint Parish Council are opposed to the application on behalf of residents and have additional concerns regarding:

- The close proximity of the site to the village of Sherbourne.
- Nuisance caused by smell and flies.
- Nuisance caused by operational noises.

In the event that the County Council is minded to allow the application the Council requests that conditions are imposed relating to the following:

- A restriction on the time and days of operation.
- An undertaking is obtained which is binding on the applicants and any successor to ensure that there is no further development on the site or increase in the area of operation.
