SBA AGM

On Saturday I braved the snow and drove to Perth to attend the SBA AGM. This proved to be an informative afternoon. There is a whole buzz of activity out there and a lot of dedicated people who make up the SBA; it was nice to put faces to names. The formal agenda as printed in your SBA monthly magazine went smoothly. For anyone interested, all the reports etc. are on the SBA website which can be accessed by SBA members.

John Coyle was elected as the new East Area rep for the SBA. His main function is to be the point of contact between the SBA executive and the local associations in both directions.

The proposal for the AGM - 'That the SBA petition the Scottish Government to invoke a moratorium on the use of the pesticides known as neonicotinoids until it is established that these substances do not have an unacceptably long half-life in the soil and that they do not damage pollinators or the soil dwelling organisms on which soil fertility depends'- was passionately debated by both sides. The motion was defeated by 31 votes for and 43 votes against and 5 abstentions.

After a welcome cup of tea, the rest of the afternoon was spent discussing the proposal for the first draft of the new SBA Constitution.
