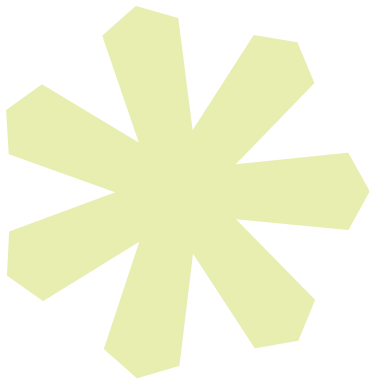


# SNOWBALL IN CINCINNATI IN JULY

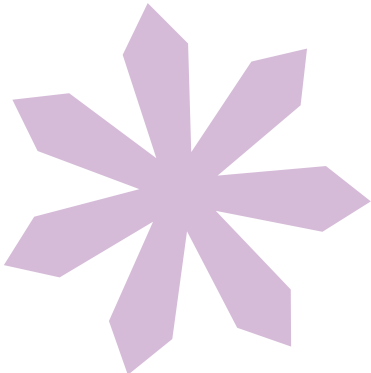

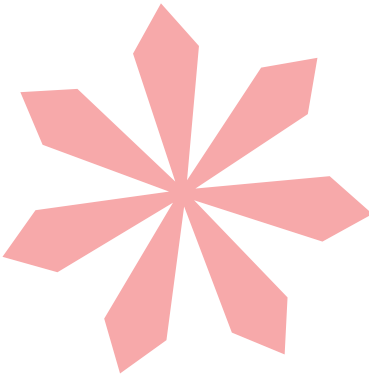
A Snowball in Cincinnati
