



Endurance

As has been mentioned several times

before, Dunwich Dynamo is on 8th and 9th July. The start is at London Fields, which is handily close to Liverpool Street Station. There is a bare minimum of organisation. Someone will be selling route sheets from about 8:00pm onwards and people will start cycling towards Dunwich when they feel like it. There is a stop around the halfway mark where food and drink is available. Traditionally, this is at Waldingfield but last year it was at Monks Eleigh. ...is its name and it's on Sunday 27th August. This is how it works: groups of riders will assemble at various points in East Anglia and they will head toward the Mid-Suffolk Light Railway at Brockford for an afternoon of beer drinking and train spotting. The Middy has a Rail'n'Ale Event on this day, and it's a Steam Day too.

There will be a D&DGCS starting point in Stowmarket, picking up at Stowupland *en route*. The Cambridge Section of the V-CC has a starting point in Elmswell. Other likely starting points are Walpole (V-CC Flat Section A team), Horham (Chickering Cycling Circle) and Diss (V-CC Flat Section B team, Choppy Warburton Fan Club and Diss & District CC). Some members of the Tricycle Association East have also expressed an interest but they'd probably forgotten that it's the weekend of Mildenhall Rally.

If any of the groups are sufficiently organised to book in advance (unlikely, I know) it should be possible to arrange 'party rate' admission to the Middy.

Bicycle Industrie

Those of you who have seen Cally's letter in News and Views about the little-known Belgian company of Bicycle Industrie: Touring, Sporting et Associative may be interested to know of a local connection. The original company name was Bicycle Industrie de Tournai SA (where SA stands for Société Anonyme, ie: a limited company). The

later name was adopted with the rise of *cyclotourisme* after World War One.

Being known as Bicycle Industrie, the company naturally called its high-wheeler "Le Grand-BI" and a surviving example of this model survives locally: in Ipswich Transport Museum.



Note how, unusually for an Ordinary, the backbone does not follow the line of the wheel, giving a rather ungainly appearance - almost as if the wheel and backbone were from different machines.
